

EED Governance




EED is a private non-profit foundation under the Belgian law, with Board of Governors representatives from:


- EU Member States & Switzerland (29)

EC contribution, 2014




Belgian taxes and social security: 13.69% of overall budget and 45.68% of EC contribution



Average size of grant per region







Spotlight on EED grantees



- Morocco: strengthening democratic participation
- Hit Radio launched a campaign to encourage young citizens to register to vote. Over 3 million YouTube users have watched "Mantsayadch", the initiative's music video with famous Moroccan pop and rap singers.
- SimSim is a website for citizens to ask audio and video questions to their parliamentarians. The first **Google Hangout** between an **MP and citizens** recently took place.

- It was named "best newcomer" at the Moldovan Centre for Independent Journalism's "Best Journalists of the Year" award ceremony.


Spotlight on EED grantees



 Syria: emergency support to local media and human rights initiative in Kafranbel

Days after extremist militia seized six media workers and confiscated or destroyed Kafranbel Media Centre's equipment, EED helped to keep it functioning and upgrade its security.

EED Recommendations for Russian language media



- EED led a feasibility study on Russian Language Media Initiatives in the Eastern Partnership and beyond
- Results of the study were presented to the EU member states and other interested donors in June 2015
- Findings underline the importance of support to quality Russianlanguage journalism
- Supported by a special grant from the Netherlands, the study goes beyond EED core activities



Key findings

- EED has become a relevant democracy-support actor that fills gaps, complements the work of other EU donors, and is responsive to the needs of grantees.
- EED has provided flexible, demand-driven, support to pro-democracy actors who would otherwise have been un(der)supported.
- EED's governance structure and operational procedures work fairly well and efficient.
